Incorporated as '**The Acme Social Club**'
in Rhode Island on 6 June 1900
"... for the purpose of literary and social enjoyment"
Associated with the Old Colony Brewers of Fall River,
the club first operated there in 1896 and 1897.

I, Charles P. Bennett, secretary of state, hereby certify that Randolph Howarth, Isaac Brooks, Jeremiah Wrigley, James E. Bradbury, and James E. Howarth have filed in the office of the secretary of state according to law, their agreement to form a corporation under the name of Acme Social Club, for the purpose of literary and social enjoyment, in accordance with law, and have also filed the certificate of the general treasurer that they have paid into the general treasury of the state the fee required by law.

Built in 1899 as one of six original Island Park buildings
the Clubhouse capitalized on the retail opportunities that
were created with the development of the resort area.

Howarth Place offered lodging and entertainment, held both a victualler's and liquor license. It was dissolved on 30 March 1928.
